The Holidays in Japan | Winter Illuminations




Winter Illuminations | A Japanese Tradition

If you're strolling through the streets of Tokyo, Sendai, or other Japanese cities between November and February, you'll likely come across a public park or historical building lit up in a dazzling display of lights. These vibrant displays are the Winter Illuminations, a tradition that dates back to 1995 when Kobe was struck by the Great Hanshin Awaji Earthquake and a light display was designed as a memorial to the victims of the quake.

The Winter Illuminations vary greatly from city to city with each adding its own personal flair to the display. Some Illuminations have recreated scenes from popular Holiday stories while others turn the display into an entertaining performance the lights synchronized to pop-music. Other illuminations feature theme parks, street vendors, and activities for families to get them to join in the Holiday spirit.

Are you heading to Japan soon for the Holiday season? Stop by one of the many Winter Illuminations across the country, you'll find no shortage of them as all 47 Prefectures feature the impressive displays!

Japan Society Junior Fellows Leadership Program




